SAA takes on Washington

Each year SAA attends the CASE ASAP District I Conference that brings together student alumni associations and foundation groups from across the Northeast to collaborate on programming ideas, leadership opportunities, and present awards to recognize the best and the brightest of student groups within the area.

When CASE ASAP announced that the 2015 National Convention would be held in Washington, D.C. this year, UConn SAA decided that the proximity and investment of two of its senior executive board members lent itself to the opportunity of a lifetime, a trip to D.C. to hear from student organizations from across the country.

President Erin McMahon and Vice President of Communication Shannon Wood, alongside advisor Jess Sokol, traveled to our nation's capital for a four day long convention. Earlier in the spring semester of 2015, Erin and Shannon submitted a presentation proposal entitled, "Gettin' Down and Dirty: Mud Volleyball for the Masses," a guide to teach other student organizations from across the country how to implement UConn's largest annual tradition, OOzeball, on their campuses. From hundreds of submissions, their presentation was selected by a panel of judges to be exhibited at the conference.

Throughout the conference, Erin, Shannon and Jess heard presentations from other student organizations on topics ranging from recruitment and retention to programming. They specifically focused on presentations from student philanthropy groups; the 2015-2016 school year also marked SAA's integration with the Student Philanthropy Association, as the Alumni Association dissolved and alumni relations became part of the UConn Foundation.

On the last day, Erin and Shannon presented on OOzeball to approximately 75 eager students from across the country.

The conference also allowed opportunities for networking between schools. UConn SAA especially bonded with the SAA of Albertus Magnus College in New Haven, CT, a fellow District I member. During breaks from the conference, Erin, Jess and Shannon also were given the opportunity to sightsee around Washington, D.C., stopping at places such as the Washington and Lincoln monuments, the White House, and a tour of the Pentagon complete with a high security screening and viewing of the 9/11 memorial.

Invigorated and energized from great presentations and new ideas, Erin, Shannon and Jess returned home to Connecticut ready to prepare this year's SAA for great success and new ideas that focus on

I am in charge of two major projects from which SAA receives commissions: the linens and care package programs. The linens program is run over the summer, as students move into campus. It is especially hard for international students to come to UConn and then go out and buy a comforter, sheet sets, fan, etc. So, we've made some improvements to the program so they have all of these materials when they check in. The program is very successful, and we get continuous orders year after year.

We run Welcome Care Packages at the beginning of the fall semester, Final Exams Packages at the end of both semesters, and other holiday-themed packages throughout the year. From Fall 2014 to Fall 2015, we more than doubled the amount of care packages purchased allowing us to not only have more money for our club to host new events and projects, but it also allowed us to get the word out about our club. This year, we included a flyer in all of the packages informing students of the events that SAA puts on and when our meeting time is. Overall, I see our program continuing to grow!
